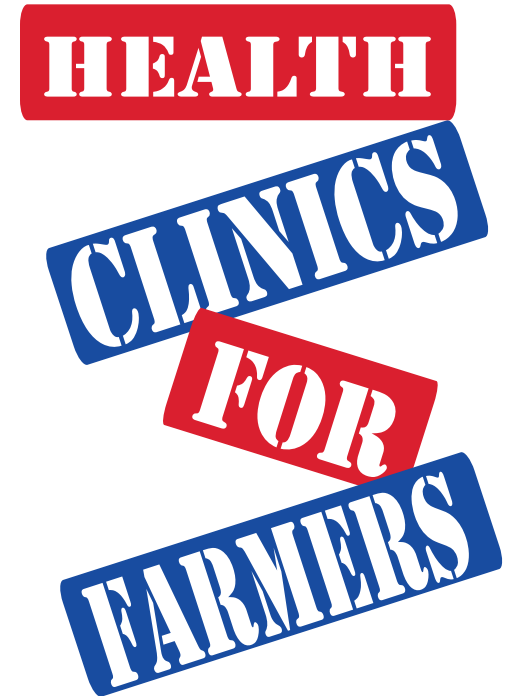

Respiratory Clinics

Numerous studies have demonstrated significantly increased risk of respiratory health concerns among farmers and farm workers. Respiratory diseases due to agricultural exposures are preventable.



Clinics are offered to assess your respiratory health either at The Network clinic or in your local RM. After completing a health questionnaire we will perform a lung function test, interpret the results and give you a copy of those results. Personalized health teaching and a referral for follow up to give your physician will be provided. Respirator fit-testing is available upon request.

Hearing Loss Prevention Clinics

Hearing loss caused by farm noise is preventable. If you have to raise your voice to be heard by someone 3 feet away from you, the noise is too loud and you should be wearing hearing protection. Exposure to noise above 85 decibels can cause hearing loss.



Clinics are offered to assess your hearing health either at The Network clinic or in your local RM. After completing a noise questionnaire we will perform a hearing test, interpret the results and give you a copy of those results. Instruction will be given on the proper use and care of hearing protection for the farm or workplace. Referrals to your family physician or other resources for a complete assessment will be provided when necessary.
